Sphygmomanometer (redirect from Blood pressure meter)

also known as a blood pressure monitor, blood pressure machine, or blood pressure gauge, is a device used to measure blood pressure, composed of an inflatable...

Blood pressure measurement

Arterial blood pressure is most commonly measured via a sphygmomanometer, which historically used the height of a column of mercury to reflect the circulating...

Hypertension (redirect from High blood pressure)

high blood pressure, is a long-term medical condition in which the blood pressure in the arteries is persistently elevated. High blood pressure usually...

Hypotension (redirect from Low blood pressure)

as low blood pressure, is a cardiovascular condition characterized by abnormally reduced blood pressure. Blood pressure is the force of blood pushing...

Pulse pressure

Pulse pressure is the difference between systolic and diastolic blood pressure. It is measured in millimeters of mercury (mmHg). It represents the force...

Sepsis (redirect from Blood poisoning)

reduced blood flow. The presence of low blood pressure, high blood lactate, or low urine output may suggest poor blood flow. Septic shock is low blood pressure...

Prehypertension (redirect from Borderline high blood pressure)

as high normal blood pressure and borderline hypertensive (BH), is a medical classification for cases where a person's blood pressure is elevated above...

Hypertensive disease of pregnancy (redirect from High blood pressure of pregnancy)

pregnancy, also known as maternal hypertensive disorder, is a group of high blood pressure disorders that include preeclampsia, preeclampsia superimposed on chronic...

Hemodynamics (redirect from Blood flow)

regulation of the pH, osmotic pressure and temperature of the whole body, and the protection from microbial and mechanical harm. Blood is a non-Newtonian fluid...

Cerebral perfusion pressure

Cerebral perfusion pressure, or CPP, is the net pressure gradient causing cerebral blood flow to the brain (brain perfusion). It must be maintained within...

Pressure ulcer

back of the cranium. Pressure ulcers occur due to pressure applied to soft tissue resulting in completely or partially obstructed blood flow to the soft tissue...

Intracerebral hemorrhage

spontaneous bleeding are high blood pressure and amyloidosis. Other risk factors include alcoholism, low cholesterol, blood thinners, and cocaine use. Diagnosis...

Vital signs (section Blood pressure)

overall health. There are four primary vital signs: body temperature, blood pressure, pulse (heart rate), and breathing rate (respiratory rate), often notated...

Aortic pressure

Central aortic pressure (CAP), central aortic blood pressure (CABP), or central aortic systolic pressure (CASP) is the blood pressure at the root of aorta...

Hypovolemic shock (section Blood loss)

halting blood loss by setting a goal of 90 mmHg systolic blood pressure hemostatic resuscitation: restoring blood volume in ways (with whole blood or equivalent)...

Shock (circulatory)

examination, and laboratory tests. A decreased pulse pressure (systolic blood pressure minus diastolic blood pressure) or a fast heart rate raises concerns. Shock...

Atherosclerosis

cholesterol levels, elevated levels of inflammatory biomarkers, high blood pressure, diabetes, smoking (both active and passive smoking), obesity, genetic...

Aortic dissection (section Blood pressure)

with distal (Stanford type B) AD, 60–70% present with high blood pressure, while 2–3% present with low blood pressure. Severe hypotension at presentation...

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
